SINGULAR PRONOUNS

- A **pronoun** is a word that takes place of one or more nouns.
- **Singular pronoun** is a word that replaces a singular noun.

First person singular pronouns	I and me
Second person singular pronouns	You
Third person singular pronouns	he, she, it, him, and her

- **Example:** Lisa gave me a bouquet of roses for my birthday.
